 - o Set up the budget and reconciled last year with this year
 - Agenda sales and 1st Quarter books.
 - Venmo payout and reimbursement to Erica because they sent the money to the wrong account
 - Finished up essay workshops and payments (all last years books)

September:

- Met with Emily to build out the new budget for 2024-2025
- Transferred 10,000 from savings to checking given checking is giving us better interest.
- Treasurer report highlights:
 - Agendas: Aug/Sept 2024 sales: \$1,036.49, exp \$965.57 = \$70.92 May 2024 sales: \$651.70 Total profit \$722.62
 - 1st Quarter books 2024 sales: \$1,275.96, exp \$0 due to money back for returned books
 - Summer reading sales: summer \$9,820.81, fall 124 = \$9,944.81, exp \$8,080.55
 Total profit \$1,740.26
 - Last summer essay workshop sales: \$35,607.95, exp \$28,440 Total profit \$7,167.95
- Adjustments from last year's budget:
- Income:
 - Increased Essay workshop sales to \$26,000
 - Increased general donations to \$500
 - Created a separate corporate membership line \$500
 - Savings transfer went from \$900 to \$10,000 (better interest)
- Expenses:
 - Created a new general student recognition for \$5,000
